

Volunteer Role Description - Kitty Fosterer

A hugely rewarding role, as a CDPA Kitty Fosterer you will provide a temporary, loving & safe home for our rescued cats & kittens with the support of other CDPA volunteers.

The Cats & Dog Protection Association of Ireland (CDPA) is a registered charity dedicated to caring and improving the lives of cats and dogs in Ireland. Our volunteers collaborate with local communities to reduce animal suffering through our Trap-Neuter-Return, foster-rehoming and welfare programmes.

Commitment required: We ask fosterers to commit to fostering cats or kittens for a minimum 6-8 weeks

Location: Own Home

Role Description

- As a CDPA fosterer you have the opportunity to care for
 - friendly cats or kittens
 - shy / spicy kittens (under 12 weeks)
 - sick, elderly or special needs kitties
 - pregnant mommas & kittens once born until they are ready for adoption
 - orphaned kittens (previous experience bottle-feeding required)
- Share weekly updates on kitty progress and photos via CDPA's facebook group
- Provide regular input for kitty personality profiles & information to help CDPA find the purrfect forever home for the kitty
- Bring cats/kittens to vet appointments as required
- Book vet appointments once approved by CDPA
- Administer treatment as required (training is provided)
- Keep record of vaccinations and microchips

- Kind, caring, patient, reliable & dedicated
- Empathetic towards cats and other volunteers

- CDPA welcomes volunteers with all levels of experience!
- Previous experience with cats, kittens is very welcome

Other Requirements



- Access to own transport to bring kitties to/from vet appointments
- Access to a device to provide updates & respond to CDPA questions via our Facebook group
