Our volunteers collaborate with local communities to reduce animal suffering through our Trap-Neuter-Return, foster-rehoming and welfare programmes.

Commitment required: We ask fosterers to commit to fostering dogs or puppies for a minimum 6-8 weeks

Role Description

- As a CDPA fosterer you have the opportunity to care for
 - o friendly dogs or puppies
 - $\circ \quad \text{sick, elderly or special needs dogs} \\$
 - $\circ\quad$ pregnant mommas & puppies once born until they are ready for adoption
 - o orphaned puppies (previous experience bottle-feeding required)
- Share weekly updates on the dogs progress and photos via CDPA's facebook group
- Provide regular input for dogs personality profiles & information to help CDPA find the perfect forever home for the dog
- Bring dogs/puppies to vet appointments as required
- Book vet appointments once approved by CDPA
- Administer treatment as required (training is provided)
- Keep record of vaccinations and microchips
