Volunteer Role Description - Fosterer Supporter

A hugely rewarding role, as a CDPA Foster Supporter you will onboard and help fosterers understand the fostering process and support them by providing advice and guidance.

The Cats & Dog Protection Association of Ireland (CDPA) is a registered charity dedicated to caring and improving the lives of cats and dogs in Ireland. Our volunteers collaborate with local communities to reduce animal suffering through our Trap-Neuter-Return, foster-rehoming and welfare programmes.

Commitment required: 6 months

Minimum weekly commitment: 6 hours (however this may change

depending on time of year / emergency cases)

Location: Online

Role Description

- Touch base with the fosters assigned to you at least once a week and fill
 out a form online you will be supplied with, can be accessed with a
 smartphone or computer
- Help organise start packs and essential items to be delivered to the foster homes
- Answer any queries the foster may have you will have extra support from a senior volunteer
- Pass on any issues to senior volunteer such as sick cats/kittens as the senior volunteer will have to make arrangements to get a vet appointment should it be needed.
- Liaise with senior volunteer about transport of cats/kittens for vet appointments should it be needed
- Keep track and remind fosters on your team of when they are due vaccines or microchip and ensure they know they have these appointments in advance
- Ensure fosters are following advice from either yourself or senior volunteers

- Previous experience in an animal rescue is very advantageous
- Have a good knowledge of cats and their behaviours

- Be willing to advise others and guide new fosters this can be done on phone or face to face
- Be able to commit to at least six hours in a week to follow up with current fosters and provide further guidance in specific cases
- Be willing to attend training and implement this training with your foster cases
